CAAI: Comprehensive Assessment of Accentedness & Intelligibility

CAAI is a comprehensive assessment battery designed to conduct systematic, scientific, quantitative, evidencebased assessments of accents and dialects. Designed to serve as a one-stop destination, CAAI targets multiple areas within the same test instead of requiring many supplementary tests. Among the twenty-two communication areas assessed are speech areas including articulation of consonants, vowels, and blends; phonological patterns, prosodic measures of syllable stress, word emphasis and sentence intonation; auditory discrimination abilities, language areas of grammar, advanced vocabulary, idiomatic use and comprehension of language, and pragmatic skills.

CAAI scores help arrive at a quantitative estimate of the client's accent-severity, baseline intelligibility and speaking rate, as well as individual performance on all speech, language, and communication areas tested. Qualitative information is also tracked across the twenty-two test sections. Besides the primary diagnostic goal, CAAI is also designed to help base intervention decisions as well as serve to compare pre- and post-therapy performance. The test also provides several <u>prognostic indicators</u> to help plan further intervention.




